Personal Safety in the Workshop

It is very important to be safe in the workshop. There are tools that if misused can be very dangerous to you, your classmates and teacher. If you work safely though, you will have fun!

This unit explains some of the rules you must follow and some of the procedures for working in the workshop areas.





Workshop Dress Code

It is important that you are dressed appropriately for the workshop to keep yourself safe. If you do not follow the dress code policy, you will be considered a safety hazard and will be denied access to the workshop.

The following code is the acceptable way to dress for the workshop.

- 1. Always wear an apron.
- 2. Ensure long hair is tied back if you have long hair please bring something to tie your hair back each period.
- 3. Do not wear open toed shoes.
- 4. No hanging jewellery which could get caught in the machinery.
- 5. Ties should be tucked in and sleeves should be rolled up.
- 6. Loose baggy clothing should not be worn.




Workshop Safety - Fire Alarm

Task 5:

	Calmly stop working, put down your tools and when instructed walk to the class assembly point following your teacher.
	Start screaming, throw your tools down and and push your way to the class assembly point and be the first person there.

If the fire alarm sounds while you are in the workshop, you will exit the classroom and turn left, exiting the building via the double doors at the end of the corridor (bottom of the middle stairs). You will walk up the hill and assemble at your class meeting point on the pitch.



Workshop Rules

- 1. Never enter a workshop or classroom without the permission of your teacher. Line up quietly outside the room.
- 2. Never leave school bags or jackets lying on the floor between benches. Leave them at the front of the room where no one will fall over them.
- 3. Always **wear an apron** to protect yourself and your clothing.
- 4. Always **WALK**—do not run!
- 5. **Never carry on or throw anything** in the workshop.
- 6. Be careful when carrying tools from the storage cupboards to your bench. Look where you are going!
- 7. Always use the tools in the way your teacher has shown you.
- 8. NEVER touch machinery or tool; your teacher has not shown you how to use.
- 9. Never go near a machine when it's in use, unless you are the operator.
- 10. Do not talk to or distract someone who is using a machine. Stand well back when it is in use.
- 11. Always wear **safety glasses** when using a machine.
- 12. Tie long hair back, tuck in ties, secure loose clothing, remove all hanging jewellery and fasten cuffs or roll up sleeves before using machinery.
- 13. Do not touch other pupils' models unless instructed to do so by your teacher.
- 14. Check your work bench at the beginning of the period and report any missing or damaged tools to your teacher immediately.
- 15. Always return tools to their correct storage place when you have finished using them.
